# What Are the Defining Characteristics of Medical Respite Care?



Medical respite care, also known as recuperative care, is acute and post-acute medical care for people experiencing homelessness who are too ill or frail to recover from a physical illness or injury on the streets but who are not ill enough to be in a hospital.

These programs provide a short-term, safe place to stay so people experiencing homelessness may have an opportunity to rest, recover, and heal in a safe environment while accessing medical care and supportive services.

# Common characteristics of these programs include the following:

- Closes the gap between medical facilities and community programs that cannot provide necessary medical and supportive services.
- Provides an economical, high-quality, and innovative space for healing aimed at lowering the burden and cost of public systems.
- Improves the efficiency of hospitals and health systems by increasing discharge options, offering emergency room diversion, decreasing inpatient length of stay, and lowering readmission rates.
- Provides advocacy for participants and secures safe dispositions that show respect for human dignity.
- Serves as an integral component of the Continuum of Care (CoC) for homeless services.
- Offers a service delivery model that reflects unique community needs, priorities, and resources.
- Provides stability and facilitates continuity of care through case management, care coordination, and health education from referral to discharge.
- Removes barriers to health care by providing an opportunity to access medical and supportive services needed to heal and recover.
- Ensures participant-centered, individualized care and discharge plans that are guided by medical needs.
- Engages participants in their recuperation and discharge planning by meeting people where they are and building a sense of trust and belonging.

### MRC is not...

Medical respite serves as a connector between the housing and healthcare continuum, but it is important to note that medical respite care is not a:

- Skilled nursing facility
- Assisted living facility
- Other long-term care facility
- Supportive housing program
- "Caregiver respite" facility
